





**DID YOU KNOW?**

There are hundreds of things that can go wrong with your vehicle. Some are simple and some are quite complicated. Over 80% of engine functions are computer controlled. The computer receives information from dozens of sensors. When a sensor reading is out of range, a trouble code is entered in the computer and the Check Engine Light is illuminated.

It's a common misconception that the trouble code will tell you exactly what is wrong. For any given trouble code, there are any number of faults that would trigger the code. For example, a code indicating a misfire on cylinder three could be due to a bad spark plug, a failed coil, ignition problems, compression issues, a bad fuel injector, etc. Each of those possibilities requires additional diagnosis to confirm or rule out a cause.

A flashing Check Engine Light indicates that a condition exists that could lead to serious, damage, and needs to be dealt with immediately as it can cause catalytic convertor damage. A steadily illuminated Check Engine Light is less urgent so you can get it checked at your convenience. But keep in mind that a minor issue today can become more serious.
